

Rabbi Joseph's Winter 2020 series of adult education classes will focus on the theme of communal responsibility, and specifically this: what is our responsibility to our community for injustice and shortcomings which we did not ourselves commit? We all acknowledge a level of community responsibility when we pay our taxes for schools and roads, for instance, for police and courts. But what is our responsibility for poverty in our community? For racism or homophobia or gender discrimination? How hard do we have to work to overcome the legacy of slavery and Jim Crow? Once we buy ourselves fuel-efficient cars or install a few solar panels, how much deeper is our responsibility for climate change? We will examine these questions from the point of view of Jewish text and tradition, trying to help us set a proper course for ourselves individually and as a Jewish community. This series WILL NOT be about contemporary politics and policy, but it WILL be about our obligations in the contemporary world.


